

Students Feedback Report

Academic Year 2020-21

Overview:

This report summarizes the feedback received from students for the academic year 2020-21. 1. Faculty Performance

- · Overall Rating: Very Good
- Key Strengths:
 - Subject Knowledge: Faculty members demonstrated excellent knowledge and mastery of their subjects.
 - Communication Skills: Despite the shift to online learning, students appreciated the clarity and effectiveness with which faculty explained complex topics.
 - Engagement: Many faculty members made efforts to engage students in online discussions and maintain an interactive learning environment.
 - Availability: Faculty members were approachable for doubt resolution and mentoring, especially through virtual office hours and online platforms.
- Areas for Improvement:
 - Students reported issues with navigating online learning platforms, including technical glitches, difficulty accessing recorded lectures, and limited interaction with faculty.

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2. Teaching Methods

- Overall Rating: Good
- **Key Strengths:**
 - o Adaptation to Online Learning: Faculty successfully adapted to online teaching, utilizing digital tools and multimedia to make the lessons engaging.
 - Interactive Sessions: Group discussions, virtual presentations, and breakout rooms in online platforms were well-received by students.
- Areas for Improvement:
 - o Students expressed a desire for more hands-on virtual workshops and lab sessions to simulate practical learning experiences.
 - A few students felt that the pace of some online lectures needed adjustment to better accommodate learning in a virtual setting.

3. Course Content

- Overall Rating: Good to Very Good
- Key Strengths:
 - o The course content remained relevant to industry trends and emerging technologies, even during the pandemic.
 - The flexibility in choosing electives allowed students to tailor their learning experience according to their interests and career goals.
- Areas for Improvement:
 - o Students suggested regular updates to course materials to reflect new developments in technology and industry practices.

4. Infrastructure and Facilities

- Overall Rating: Good
- Key Strengths:

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- The institution successfully facilitated access to online resources, including ebooks, journals, and virtual lab simulations.
- Digital infrastructure, such as online learning platforms, was appreciated for enabling a smooth transition to remote learning.
- Areas for Improvement:
 - Some students faced issues with internet connectivity during online sessions, highlighting the need for improved digital infrastructure support.



 Students highlighted the difficulty of engaging in practical and lab-based courses through remote learning, which are essential components of their academic programs.

5. Student Support and Resources

- Overall Rating: Very Good
- Key Strengths:
 - The institution's counseling and mental health support services were praised for being accessible and supportive during the pandemic.
 - Career guidance and placement support continued effectively through virtual platforms, helping students with internships and job placements.
- · Areas for Improvement:
 - More industry interactions, including online guest lectures and virtual industry visits, were recommended to maintain industry exposure during remote learning.
 - Some students requested a review of the fee structure given the shift to online learning and the financial difficulties faced by families during the pandemic.
 - Students expressed concerns about increased stress, anxiety, and isolation due to prolonged online learning and lockdown measures

Summary of Findings:

The feedback for the academic year 2020-21 reflects a positive student experience despite the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. Faculty performance and student support services received high praise, particularly for their adaptability to online learning. Teaching methods and course content were generally well-received, though there is room for improvement in practical and hands-on learning opportunities. Infrastructure support for online learning was rated positively, but issues with connectivity and access to physical resources were noted.


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
