

Starlink - Elon's Gift

Have you ever wondered how a live cricket match from thousands of kilometers away can be streamed in near real-time? It's primarily due to transcontinental cables stretched out on the ocean floor, to be sure. They serve as data conduits - the actual physical roads via which information flows. However, cables are regarded outdated these days, and numerous attempts have been made to discover an alternative solution. Project Starlink, the brainchild of SpaceX and Elon Musk, is arguably the most ambitious endeavour. Musk's Starlink project aims to remove physical connections entirely in favour of data streaming via a constellation of satellites.

SpaceX has been launching hundreds of satellites for months. They plan to launch around 42,000 satellites into space in the future. At the very least, these satellites will allow them to cover virtually the whole earth's surface area and offer an uninterrupted flow of data. The service is in beta, and you can buy a Starlink kit for \$99 per month, which includes a pizza-sized dish antenna, a tripod, and a Wi-Fi router. That is all that is required to gain access to Space Internet.

Meanwhile, Musk wants a piece of the trillion-dollar global telecommunications industry, and if all goes as planned, SpaceX could earn \$30-\$50 billion per year just from delivering internet services. They are not only looking at developed markets. A SpaceX vice president responded to a TRAI comment document last year it has suggested that India establish a framework for regulating and permitting satellite broadband technology in the nation. In reality, this was one of Starlink's most significant promises. The capacity to provide continuous internet connection in the world's most distant locations, where connectivity is always spotty at best. Will it be a cost-effective option? We have no idea. However, there are numerous areas where cables cannot be used. Satellites, on the other hand, are not bound by such constraints.

However, this does not mean that Starlink does not have any possible drawbacks. The satellites themselves are now the most significant bottleneck. Consider how these floating objects impact astronomers who observe the dark sky. Furthermore, this issue is not going away anytime soon. SpaceX is one of the first companies to enter a new market. However, many others will soon follow. OneWeb, Telesat, and Amazon's Project Kuiper are all options. The Chinese are also planning to launch thousands of satellites at once. So we have an uncontrolled "space," some ambitious billionaires and a generational technology leap that may introduce new issues.

Importance of Education

"Stairs are the pathway to move from one level to another vertically". Constructed almost 2500 BC ago they are very essential for any kind of building; but what if I tell you that a structure present in Sri Lanka have a complete city on the top of a rock discovered by Jonathan Forbes in 1831 and has no stairs or any kind of pathway to move from ground to the top and stands 660ft tall!





Yes it's not easy to digest this but the truth can't be hidden. And this structure proves that modern day historians are estimating history wrongly! Sigiriya (aka Ravana's palace) is a giant rock which confirms that a civilization more advanced than us existed on this beautiful land. As there are no marks on the rock, it confirms that hammer and chisel were not the first tools used by beings for construction! The rock consists of horizontal grooves which express that more advanced tools which could easily cut rocks like ice cream existed! What's more shocking is that when there are no stairs how can there be structures built over the flat topped rock?

If there are no marbles in almost 100 kms of range how can there be marble slabs present on Sigiriya? It consists of almost 3 million bricks which were used in construction of large structures on the flat top. And if we think these materials were transported. Then how? Without any vertical pathway to the top?

Modern day historians believe that this structure was constructed almost 1500 years ago but by carbon dating of paintings on the rock walls we get to know that it was constructed much before than this.

SIGIRIYA have large tanks for water storage with a proper drainage system which helps the tank tonever overflow and never get dry! The tank is one of its kind as it is constructed by removing 3500 tons of granite. Can we use only chisels and hammers to remove almost one of the strongest rocks on earth? Answer is a clear NO!





Not only in construction is the palace equipped with military expertise!

Here in the image you may see how cleverly these rocks are balanced vertically on a slope with a 1000 ton rock on the top. This is not natural at all from any perspective! One small movement of these rocks can shut this complete road and all the enemies travelling through this will be crushed under it!

Sigiriya or The Ravana's palace or lion's rock has been declared as a UNESCO World Heritage site due to its immense architecture, mysterious city present on the flat topped rock and militarily expertises. But all these mysteries will remain as a puzzle until and unless we admit that we are not the most developed beings, and all the so called "mythological characters" were in real!.



Digital India

Today, a major portion of the Indian population uses the Internet. People belonging to even the remotest villages now possess facilities that connect them to the outer world. The movement of Digital India began on July 1st 2015, led by the current prime minister of India, Honorable shri Narendra Modi. Digital India is a program under the Government of India, started in 2015. It is an umbrella program which covers various aspects of the Digital advancement of the country.

He launched Digital India with a vision to provide easy access to internet services for all the citizens of India. He wanted the people residing in the small villages, to be a major part of this campaign and the one to benefit the most out of it.

The key vision of this government campaign is broadly divided into three heads:

- 1. E-Governance for all citizens of India
- 2. Digitally Empowering citizens
- 3. Providing a digital Infrastructure for all

The movement of Digital India was made possible with the help of top Industrialists and commerce companies in India like Wipro, Tata Industries, and Reliance Industries.

Digital India campaign includes various programs like Andriod mobile application work as an education and recruitment portal and also offers different kinds of services like online ticket booking and tax payment. Another sector very much benefitted by this movement is the Banking sector. With the

launch of indigenous debit cards such as RUPAY and by UPI ID's, the use of banking services has elevated.

According to a report by Nascom and Akamai, Indian internet users were likely to hit 730 MILLION by 2020 which is more than double the users that were five years before.



The Special Forces of India

India has several Special Forces (SF) units. The three branches of the Indian Armed Forces have separate Special Forces units, viz. the Para SF of the Indian Army, the MARCOS of the Indian Navy and the Garud Commando Force of the Indian Air Force. There are other special forces which are not controlled by the military but operate under civilian organizations such as Home ministry's National Security Guard.

Small groups from the military SF units are deputed in the Armed Forces Special Operations Division, which has a unified command and control structure.

• Para (Special Forces)

The Parachute Regiment (Special Forces), or Para (SF), are the special forces of the Indian Army.

This unit was created in June 1966 in the aftermath of the 1965 Indo-Pakistani war, which took part in the 1965 war formed the first nucleus of the permanent Para commando battalion which was to be raised under the Parachute Regiment. By 1969, the unit had grown into 2 battalions, viz. the 9 Para and the 10 Para. The unit's first combat missions were conducted during the 1971 Indo-Pakistani war in which they undertook raids against Pakistan's military. In 1988, the 3 Para (SF) and 6 Para participated in the first known foreign intervention by the Indian Army during Operation Cactus in Maldives. Operation Cactus was launched to thwart a coup against the government of President Maumoon Abdul Gayoom. In the late 1980s, the Para (SF) were deployed in Sri Lanka where they conducted helicopter-borne assaults and security operations.

• Marcos Force (Indian Navy)

This force also know as DADI VALA FOZ and very deadliest force.

First conceived in 1985, the Marine Commando Force, also called MARCOS, was raised in February 1987. It is the Special Forces unit of the Indian Navy, Initially, the U.S. Navy SEALs and British Special Forces trained a few officers of the Indian navy who formed the first core of MARCOS. MARCOS had participated in efforts against the 2008 Mumbai attacks alongside the National Security Guards but their effectiveness was diluted due to bureaucratic indecision. MARCOS have also been deployed in anti-piracy operations. About training of MARCOS is very deadliest training the selection percentage ratio. After a 10 week long basic training, MARCOS are sent to train alongside Indian Army's Para commandos for 3 weeks. Advanced training follows, during which MARCOS learn skills such as sky-diving, weapons training, counter-insurgency, languages and warfare in different terrains, among other things. Each MARCOS squad, called Prahar, is composed of 8 soldiers.

• Garud Commando Force (Indian Air Force)

The Garud commandos are the special forces of the Indian Air Force (IAF). Their tasks include counter-terrorism, hostage rescue, providing security to IAF's vulnerably located assets and various air force-specific special operations. First conceived in 2002, this unit was officially established on February 6, 2004.

All Garuds are volunteers who are imparted a 52-week basic training, which includes a three-month probation followed by special operations training, basic airborne training and other warfare and survival skills. The last phase

of basic training sees Garuds been deployed to get combat experience. Advanced training follows, which includes specialized weapons training. The mandated tasks of the Garuds include direct action, special reconnaissance, rescuing downed pilots in hostile territory, establishing airbases in hostile territory and providing air-traffic control to these airbases. The Garuds also undertake suppression of enemy air defenses and the destruction of other enemy assets such as radars, evaluation of the outcomes of Indian air strikes and use laser designators to guide Indian air strikes

• Special Group (Research and Analysis Wing)

The Special Group is a confidential Special Forces unit of the Research and Analysis Wing. It was formed in 1981. The responsibilities of the Special Group includes clandestine intelligence operations and covert operations, with which the Government of India may not wish to be overtly associated.

• Special Frontier Force (Research and Analysis Wing)

The Special Frontier Force is a confidential Special Forces unit of the Research and Analysis Wing which was created on 14 November 1962 to undertake operations against the Chinese People's Liberation Army. The force was put under the direct supervision of the Intelligence Bureau, and later, the Research and Analysis Wing, India's external intelligence agency. It consists primarily of Tibetan people who are tasked to undertake operations in the tough terrain of the Himalayas and Tibet, whose main goal was to conduct covert operations behind Chinese lines in case of another war between the People's Republic of China and India.

• National Security Guard (NSG)

The National Security Guard, which is a specialized counter-terrorism Federal Contingency Force. The NSG was formally created in 1986. It is modeled on the basis of the British Special Air Service and the German GSG 9. The NSG are popularly referred to as the 'Black Cats' due to their distinct black uniforms. In the recent web series called test case and surgical strike. In April 2017, a web series titled The Test Case was released featuring the fictional story of the first woman training to serve in a combat role within the Indian special force. Uri: The Surgical Strike (2019) is a dramatized account of the tactical strike reportedly conducted by the Para (Special Forces) on the camps of terrorists across the Line of Control in retaliation for the 2016 Uri attack.

Independence Day Celebrations at ITM Group of Institutions



The Managing Director Dr. Daulat Singh Chauhan also motivated the students and said that to lead a good professional life, it is must to be a good human being.




September 03, 2019







- 5 Facilitate community building, character development and career advancement for both mentors and mentees.


